They offer short- and long-term group homes for children traumatized by neglect and abuse; child welfare and family services; foster care and adoption programs; Head Start and Early Head Start programs to give infants, toddlers and preschoolers from low-income families the best possible start in life; and award-winning day care on a sliding scale for families of all income levels. Hephzibah offers intergenerational volunteer opportunities, including homework helpers, technology mentors, heartmates (long-term mentoring), helpmates (wherever the need is greatest at the moment), and Head Start assistants. Cluster Tutoring is a nonprofit, community-based organization that provides free one-to-one tutoring to more than 100 students primarily in the Austin neighborhood of Chicago's West Side. The program was founded in 1990 by a 'cluster' of local churches and community groups in response to the disturbing statistic that less than half of Chicago Public School students graduate from high school. Each tutor is matched with a student, and the tutor-student pair works together during the school year to prepare the student for a successful academic career. Volunteers can tutor either on Tuesdays at the Pine Avenue Church in Austin, or Thursdays, at the First United Church of Oak Park. Each weekly session runs from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. from the end of September until mid-May. Interested volunteers can
